



Prospect Reservoir

Prospect Reservoir precinct open
6 am–4.30 pm November–March;
7 am–4.30 pm April–October

Parkland Rd, which follows the base of Prospect Dam wall, is closed to traffic.

Prospect Creek Cycleway & Warali Wai; to Fairfield.

Ride over the graceful sandstone arches of Boothtown aqueduct.

Follow the water supply channel that links Sydney to water storages to the south.

Take a break at Pimelia or The Dairy picnic areas, both adjacent to the Sydney Olympic Games equestrian cross-country course.

Visit the Saturday markets at Fairfield Showground – one of the largest in NSW, with more than 600 stalls. Open 9 am–4 pm.

The Prospect Creek Cycleway links Prospect Reservoir and Fairfield Town Centre. 8km of the path, between Gipps Rd, Smithfield, and Fairfield Rd, Fairfield, is enhanced by Warali Wai, four artworks and path markers that tell Darug stories about the plants and animals of Prospect Creek. Darug elders are this area's traditional custodians. Warali wai is a Darug word for possum.

From Albert St to Prospect Reservoir, the route follows the disused 1888 Sydney water supply canal.

The route west is marked by the huge Sydney water supply pipes.

Young cyclists will love the animals and rural flavour of Fairfield City Farm, open daily from 9 am to 4.30 pm. Entry fees apply.

To Prospect Creek Cycleway, Warali Wai & Prospect Reservoir.

It's 5.5km of easy cycling on the Parramatta-Liverpool Rail Trail back to Guildford.

SCENIC ROUTE

Entirely on off-road paths, this 29km loop winds through tranquil parklands and – from high points in Western Sydney Regional Park – provides outstanding views of Greater Sydney.
